



Chaucie's Place works passionately to empower the community to end youth sexual abuse and suicide by offering evidence-informed, high-quality prevention programs so all children can live free from harm and to their highest potential.

BODY SAFETY EDUCATION

Chaucie's Place is proud to have adopted Child and Teen Lures to support our Smart Steps™ Body Safety Programming. While Smart Steps is extremely effective and evidence-informed, Child and Teen Lures are both evidence-based programs that are needed to meet legislative guidelines from SEA 355.

This new format will provide prevention in child sexual abuse along with all other forms of child abuse, neglect, bullying, and cyber-bullying. The school is responsible for buying a parent handbook for each child. The cost is \$1.00/bk for K-6 and \$1.25 for 7-12. Alternately, we can order books for your school for \$2.00/bk. We provide instruction through available grant funding. If grant funding is not available, the price is \$1,000.00/building.

If 6th, 7th and 8th are combined, 6th grade receives 7-12 curriculum. If 6th grade is kept with elementary, they receive the 5th grade curriculum.

K - 6

SMART STEPS WITH SUPPORT FROM CHILD LURES PREVENTION

Model options: (Each program lasts 45 minutes)

Option 1

There will be two presenters designated to your building for the week and each classroom teacher may choose the time he/she wishes to have his/her classroom presentation. Talk Time will still be implemented at various times throughout the week. This will be agreed upon with the school representative.

Option 2

Two Presenters will come in and take over a special area class that all the children have within the week such as physical education. The presenter will present as P.E. classes are held. If there are classes not on the P.E. rotation, the second presenter will present in those rooms at the teacher's time choice and run Talk Time.

SMART STEPS WITH SUPPORT FROM TEEN LURES PREVENTION

Model options: (Each program lasts 1 hour)

Option 1

Two (or more) presenters designated to your building for the week. Each classroom teacher may choose the time they wish to have their classroom presentation. Talk Time will be implemented at various agreed upon times throughout the week.

Option 2

Two (or more) presenters take over a special area class that all the children have within the week. The presentation will be given as classes are held. If there are classes not on the given classes rotation, the second presenter will present in those rooms at the teacher's time choice and run Talk Time.

Option 3

Multiple (based on school size) convocation style sessions. Talk Time would be made available after each session or at a time determined by school representative.

STEWARDS OF CHILDREN

Using the 5 Steps to Protecting Our Children™ as a framework, Stewards of Children® is a training that teaches adults practical actions to prevent child sexual abuse or intervene if abuse is suspected. This training also includes Child Abuse and Neglect (CAN), an additional training for recognizing and reporting child abuse and neglect. For SOC/CAN, the total training time is 3 hours. This will fulfill the mandate in SEA 447. Each class can hold a maximum of 40 people and the cost is \$15.00/person.

5 STEPS

TO PROTECTING CHILDREN

1. Learn the Facts

The facts about child sexual abuse can be staggering, but they can help us understand the risks children face.

2: Minimize Opportunity

If you eliminate opportunities for children to be in isolated, one-on-one situations, you can dramatically reduce the risk of abuse.

3: Talk About It

Children often keep abuse a secret, but talking openly about our bodies, sex, and boundaries can encourage children to share.

4: Recognize the Signs

Don't expect obvious signs when a child is being abused. Signs are often there, but you have to know what to look for.

5: React Responsibly

Be prepared to react responsibly if a child discloses abuse to you, or if you suspect or see that boundaries have been violated.

OUTCOMES

- Increased awareness of the prevalence, consequences, and circumstances of child sexual abuse.
- New skills to help adults prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.
- Positive change to organizational policies and procedures.
- Individual empowerment through an understanding of personal responsibility and actionable ways to make a difference.

LIFELINES

Lifelines® is a comprehensive youth suicide prevention program that educates adults how to recognize when a young person is at potential risk of suicide and understand how and where to access help. Lifelines® is a part of the National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices and have also been included in the Suicide Prevention Resource Center's Best Practice Registry. Lifelines is \$600.00 per school with a \$250.00 administrative fee. Mileage at the IRS rate will be charged for each program.

PROGRAM GOALS

- To increase the likelihood that members of school/organizational communities can identify potentially suicidal youth, know how to initially respond to them, and how to rapidly get help for them.
- To create a competent community that cultivates a holistic approach to suicide prevention in which the entire community is involved in prevention.
- To increase the likelihood that troubled adolescents are aware of and have immediate access to helping resources and seek such help as an alternative to suicidal actions.
- To increase school/organizational confidence regarding suicide prevention, intervention and postvention.

FOUR-PART PROGRAM:

Part 1: Administration Readiness Consultation on the school's crisis plan on suicide.

Part 2: Training for Staff and Volunteers
This portion for schools would be our QPR training to meet legislative mandates.

Part 3: Parent Workshop
A 60 to 90-minute presentation to educate parents on warning signs as well as resources for getting help, and to inform about the school's policy and procedures on suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention.

Part 4: Student Curriculum
A student curriculum will be provided to be delivered in the manner the school chooses. It is currently designed for children in grades 5-12. This can be delivered in (2) 90-minutes sessions or (4) 45-minutes sessions.

QPR

QPR Stands for Question, Persuade, and Refer - the 3 simple steps anyone can learn to help save a life from suicide. In QPR, learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone for help. You will become a gatekeeper: someone in a position to recognize a crisis and the warning signs that someone may be contemplating suicide.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Learn how to recognize risk factors, warning signs, and protective factors of suicide.
- Learn how suicide affects your community with up-to-date statistics.
- Learn how to offer hope to someone in suicidal crisis.
- Learn how to reduce access to lethal means.
- Learn how to get help and save a life.

PROGRAM DETAILS

Each class can hold a maximum of 40 people and the cost is \$15/person. We can train in multiple sessions as well as bring more than one presenter to present multiple sessions within the same time frame. This training is 2-hours in length.
